GENES DAY 2019 supports World Down Syndrome Awareness Day — observed **MARCH 21** worldwide but throughout the month in northern Colorado.

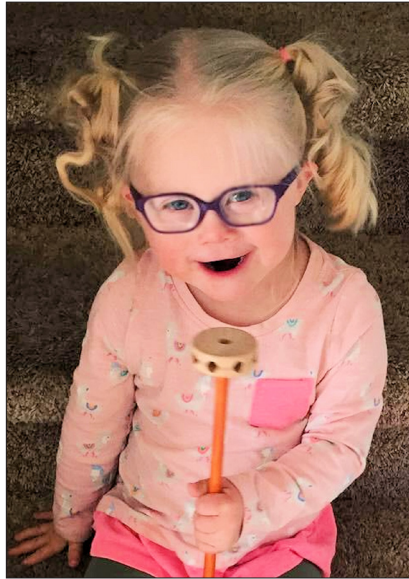
The Fort Collins Youth Clinic sponsors Genes Day to support the International Mosaic Down Syndrome Association ([imdsa](http://imdsa.org)).
